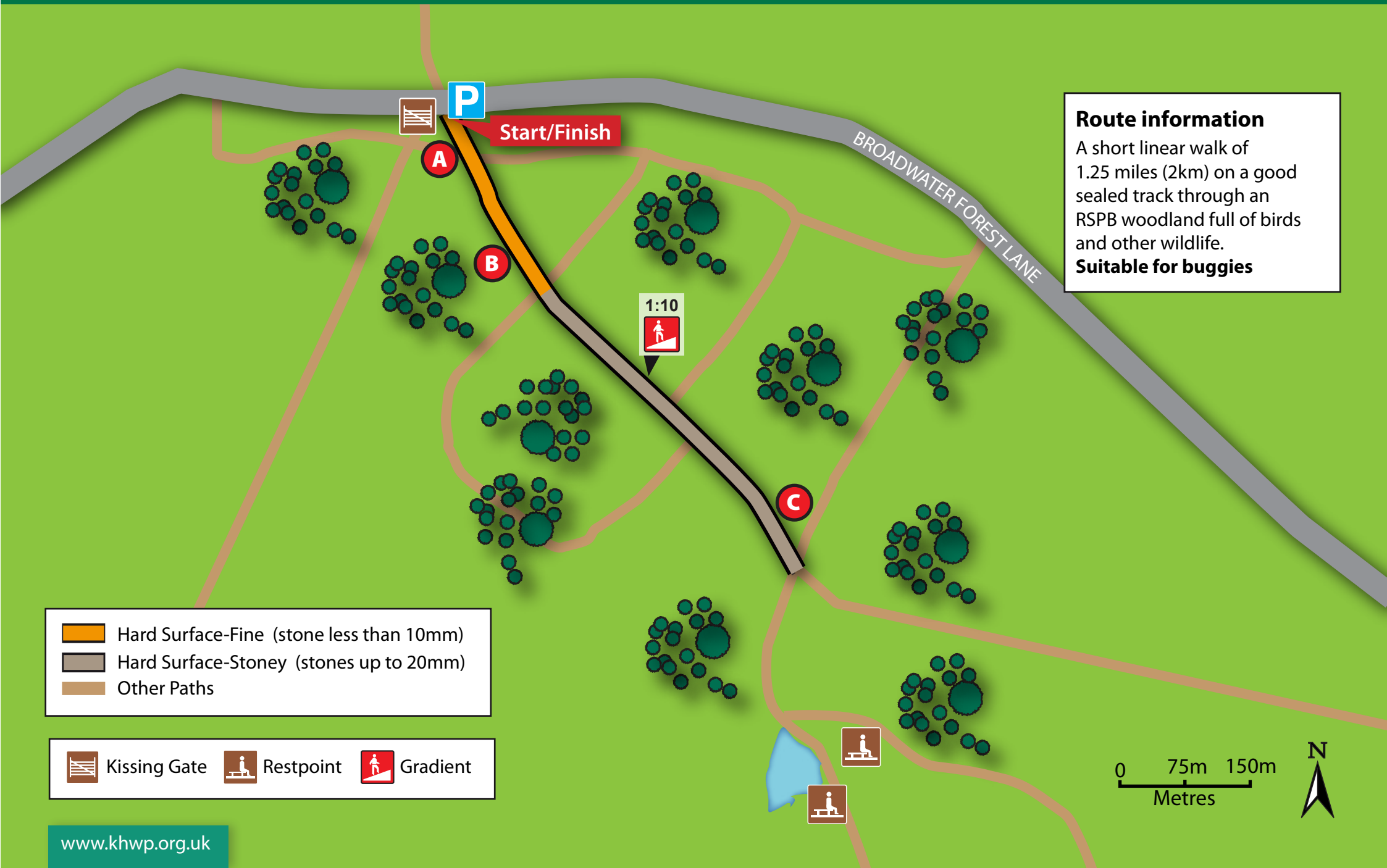


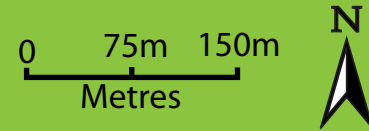
# Broadwater Warren



**Route information**  
A short linear walk of 1.25 miles (2km) on a good sealed track through an RSPB woodland full of birds and other wildlife.  
**Suitable for buggies**

- Hard Surface-Fine (stone less than 10mm)
- Hard Surface-Stoney (stones up to 20mm)
- Other Paths

- Kissing Gate
- Restpoint
- Gradient





### How to get to Broadwater Warren

**Road:** From Tunbridge Wells, take the A26 south towards Crowborough. After 2.1 miles (3.4km), turn right into Broadwater Forest Lane. Continue along Broadwater Forest Lane for 0.8 miles (1.3km) and the reserve car park is on the left-hand side.

### Additional information

The site has a free car park.

**Opening times:** The car park is open all year from 7am to 7pm or dusk, whichever is earlier.

**Site/organisation info:** The RSPB acquired Broadwater Warren in 2007. It is hoped the site will see the return of rare and threatened birds such as nightjars and woodcocks, and also other wildlife that was once present in the area.

### Route description

**Start:** Broadwater Warren car park, start at the hard surfaced path close to the large roofed information board.

- A** Go straight on path
- B** Head straight on to nightjar viewing area
- C** Continue past nightjar viewing area to end of surfaced path

To return retrace steps.

The woodland is being managed for wildlife so on occasion, during the winter, areas will be closed to the public to allow forestry work to be undertaken.
