

# Ashdown Forest Educational Opportunities



This leaflet details the opportunities available to schools to help them use Ashdown Forest as a teaching resource.

Whether requiring a tutor-led visit on the Forest, field equipment to help you run a self-guided session or resources suitable for classroom use, a number of options are available.

Ashdown Forest is steeped in history, rich in wildlife and beautiful whatever time of the year. Originally a deer hunting forest in Norman times, Ashdown Forest is now the largest free public access space in the South East and lies at the centre of the High Weald Area of Outstanding Natural Beauty (AONB). Open all year, it is a great place for walking and enjoying spectacular views over the Sussex countryside and is known the world over as the 'home' of Winnie-the-Pooh.

### Winnie-the-Pooh Story Sack

A Winnie-the-Pooh Story Sack, suitable for Key Stage 1 pupils, can be borrowed to use in your school for up to 3 weeks. Ashdown Forest is the 'home' of this very famous bear and using A.A Milne's book, The House at Pooh Corner, as a springboard for activities, the Story Sack is full of cross-curricular resources and ideas. You will need to book, collect and return the sack to the Ashdown Forest Centre.



#### Nature v Nurture Pebate Pack

Easy to use and designed to inform and promote discussion with Key Stage 2 children prior to, and during, a visit to Ashdown Forest. This Debate Pack looks at the key management issue of cutting down trees, aiming to promote awareness of Ashdown Forest itself and an understanding of why such action is needed. ## Renewable Energy Kit

A Renewable Energy Kit, suitable for Key Stages 1 - 3, is available to hire from the Ashdown Forest Centre. The kit is designed to support various aspects of the geography and science National Curriculum, is easy to assembly, interactive and engaging. Comprising a wind turbine, water turbine and solar panel, the kit can effectively demonstrate how renewable energy can be transformed into light, sound and kinetic forms. You will need to book, collect and return the kit to the Ashdown Forest Centre.

## Options A & B - Sussex Wildlife Trust Workshops, KS1 & KS2

All equipment is provided and the 'hands on' sessions are run by an experienced tutor from the Sussex Wildlife Trust. Activities include:

- mini-beast hunting & habitat studies
- mirror walk find out about how the trees survive and the wildlife they support
- tracking activities discover which creatures live on the Forest
- land use history how has the Forest been used in the past?

All of our cross-curricular sessions can be tailored to suit your needs - just ask!

### Options C & D - Self-Guided Visits

You are welcome to visit the Forest but carry out your own self-guided activities without the aid of a tutor. With Option C, you can hire equipment from us to support your teaching and learning. If you do not require any equipment or activity ideas choose Option D.

**Explorer Packs** - basic field work equipment is available to support your self-guided session. Download a list of available resources from <a href="https://www.ashdownforest.org">www.ashdownforest.org</a> fill in what you would like to use, send it back and the equipment will be ready on the day.

**Field Packs** - 'Beauty and the Beasts' (KS1), Ashdown Art (KS2) and Natural Numeracy (KS2) Field Packs have been put together for use on the Forest. Each Pack contains activity suggestions, instructions and enough equipment for approx 30 children. Let us know which Pack you would like to hire during your visit. **Education Barn** - A fully equipped classroom base for your visit - somewhere to store your things when out on the Forest and an area to work in or eat your packed lunch.

**Information Barn** - A display of information relating to the Forest and a small shop where you can purchase 'pocket money' items.
